ESC / ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL 1992

Article 4

- Enable older persons to remain full members of society for as long as possible, to choose their life-style and to lead independent lives
- Guarantee support for older persons living in institutions respecting their privacy and participation in decisions

EU HUMAN RIGHTS INSTRUMENT

CHARTER OF FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS

- . Legally binding
- . One text with all fundamental rights protected at Union level
- . Compliance by institutions at national and EU level
- . Provides right to effective remedy
- . Prohibits discrimination on ground of age
- . Respects rights of older persons to lead a life in dignity and participate in social and cultural life

GAPS AND CHALLENGES

Pension Systems Reforms

 on-going to guarantee adequacy and sustainability in long term

(incentives for longer working lives; raising retirement age; stricter criteria; adjustment mechanisms)

in response to crisis

(reduced indexation; decrease in amounts of benefits with negative impact on standard of living)

GAPS AND CHALLENGES

Long-term care

- Widening the range of options (health care and social services)
- · Supporting de-institutionalisation

Balancing choice / financial sustainability
