Colorado Members: Transportation Challenges Limit Community Livability

Transportation is a major element in maintaining personal independence and a high quality of life. Flexible transportation options are essential for accessing health care services, establishing and maintaining social contacts, and preserving independence and general well being¹.

Today, older persons are heavily reliant on the automobile to take them where they need and want to go. Even in urban and suburban areas where public transportation is available, older adults maintain a heavy reliance on the automobile.

As the population ages and more persons experience barriers to driving, more attention must be given to policies that assure persons have flexible and safe mobility options that allow them to get the services they need. AARP Colorado is examining a myriad of transportation issues that will affect the quality of life of all Coloradoans as they age. This information will be used to help define appropriate policies and strategies to aid members in accessing needed transportation services.

- **♣** Colorado members are highly reliant on the automobile to get them to where they need and want to go. More than nine in ten members (93%) say they are licensed to drive. Nearly all licensed drivers (97%) report that when they need to get someplace they generally drive.
- ₩ While most members have access to public transportation, few use it regularly. Among those members that who report they have access to public transportation (85%), about half (47%) live within one-quarter mile from the nearest stop. Notably, 86 percent of those with access to public transportation report they do not use it at all.
- ♣ Half of drivers agree that it would be difficult for them to remain in their current community if they were no longer able to drive. Nearly half of members identified two things that would help them to continue to live in their neighborhood if they were less mobile than they currently are: more driving alternatives and more delivery services for groceries, prescription drugs, and other daily necessities.
- **Those members with multiple health and disability problems are the most likely to be isolated and have few transportation alternatives.**

Methodology

AARP conducted the Colorado Transportation Survey between October 4 and November 1, 2007. Mail surveys were sent to a randomly selected stratified sample of members. Two thousand members were asked to participate in the statewide sample which excluded the cities of Denver, Fort Collins, Pueblo, and Grand Junction. An additional 1,000 members were randomly selected from each of these four cities.

Each sampled member was contacted about the survey in four ways: a pre-notification postcard, the survey itself, a reminder postcard, and a second survey. Of those surveyed, 3,361 returned completed questionnaires by the survey end date, yielding a response rate of 56 percent. The survey has a sampling error of plus or minus one percent.

Since health and disability affect a driver's ability to drive safely and are interrelated, a health and disability status index has been created to simultaneously capture the variation in each measure.² The HDS index draws data from two survey questions: *Question 18*, "How would you describe your current health?" and *Question 19*, which assesses the difficulties the members have in twelve key routine activities such as reading, hearing, lifting, climbing stairs, and walking (See Appendix I: Annotated Survey Questionnaire).

The health status of a respondent is recorded on a 5-point scale with *excellent* health rated as 5 and *poor* health rated as 1. The count of disabilities is used to describe disability status. For example, a respondent who reports no disabilities gets a disability score of 0, while a respondent with six disabilities gets a score of 6. The HDS index rating is then calculated by subtracting the number of disabilities from the health rating. Thus, a respondent who reports that he/she is in *excellent* health with no disabilities has an HDS score of 5, while a respondent who reports *poor* health and six disabilities has an HDS score of -5. On the basis of their HDS scores, members are classified into four groups: *excellent* HDS (a score of 5), *good* HDS (a score of 3 or 4), fair HDS (a score of 1 or 2), or *poor* HDS (a score of 0 to -11).

Response rates for the subgroups are: Statewide, 53%; Denver, 54%; Fort Collins, 58%; Grand Junction, 59%; and Pueblo, 59%. For these subgroups, the sampling errors are: Statewide, $\pm 3.0\%$, Denver, $\pm 4.2\%$, and Pueblo, Fort Collins, and Grand Junction, $\pm 4.0\%$.

Throughout the report, statistics representing member responses are reported in percentages. Percentages may not add up to 100 due to rounding.



Detailed Findings

What types of transportation do AARP members use?

Most Colorado AARP members are licensed drivers and they generally drive to where they need and want to go.




*Percentages exceed 100% due to multiple responses.

More than nine in ten members (93%) say they are licensed to drive. Nearly all licensed drivers (97%) report that when they need to get someplace they generally drive. Seventeen percent of licensed drivers have *poor* HDS.

Nearly all members (98%) with *excellent* HDS report that they drive compared to three in four (74%) with *poor* HDS. Conversely, nearly half (46%) of those with *poor* HDS say they ride share compared to slightly less than one in four (24%) of those with *excellent* HDS.

Nearly all (97%) members report that during a typical week they leave their house or apartment to go somewhere, and more than three in five report they get out of their homes more than five times in a typical week. Only one percent indicates they do not leave their house at all during a typical week.


- ♣ Members in Fort Collins (69%) are more likely to get out five or more times per week than those in Pueblo (58%) or Grand Junction (59%).
- ♣ Members with *excellent* HDS (84%) are far more likely to get out five or more times a week than those with *poor* HDS (29%). Notably, five percent of those with *poor* HDS indicate they do not leave their home at all.



Among licensed drivers (n=2,954), seven in ten report they drive at least daily, and another one in ten indicate they drive weekly. Only four percent report they drove once or twice or not at all in the past two months.

♣ More members statewide (72%), in Pueblo (72%), and in Fort Collins (75%) report driving daily than those in Denver (65%).


Frequency of Driving During Past Two Months (n=2,954 Licensed Drivers)



Nearly nine in ten (89%) members who drive and have *excellent* HDS report they drive daily compared to less than half (46%) of those with *poor* HDS.

Few Colorado members ride share on a regular basis. Two percent say they ride share on a daily basis, and about one in ten report they ride share at least weekly. More than half report they either rode with others once or twice or not at all during the past two months.

Frequency of Ride Sharing During Past Two Months (N=3,361)




How do AARP members view public transportation?


Using their best knowledge, members were asked whether public transportation (buses, commuter rail, etc.) is available in their community. More than four in five (85%) say it is available.

- ▲ More members in Denver report using public transportation than those members in the other locations in the study (Denver, 19%; Statewide, 9%; Pueblo, 2%, Fort Collins, 5%; and Grand Junction, 2%).
- While members residing in cities and in suburbs have the greatest access to public transportation, a
- majority of members living in small cities and rural areas report it is available to them (cities, 92%; suburbs, 87%; small towns, 73%; and rural areas, 63%).
- ♣ Only three percent report they had used public transportation at least weekly in the past two months. Nearly nine in ten (86%) report they have not used it in the past two months.
- ♣ About half of Colorado members report that the nearest transportation stop is less than a quarter mile from their home, and nearly one in five say it is within half a mile.

Members were provided a list of benefits to using public transportation and were asked to indicate the most important aspect of use. About one in five indicate that it gets them where they want to go and about one in seven report that they do not have to drive.









What problems do AARP members experience with public transportation?

The most common problem cited by members who have used public transportation in the past two months or who may use public transportation in the future is having adequate shelter from the weather while waiting.





Members with *poor* HDS are significantly more likely to say they have a major problem with numerous aspects of transportation use than those with *excellent* HDS.

Members were asked how often they have problems finding transportation to the following destinations: medical appointments, activities with family, activities with friends, their place of worship, grocery shopping, drug store or pharmacy, shopping for clothes or household items, entertainment, volunteer activities, and work.


Only about one in ten members report they sometimes or often experience transportation problems with grocery shopping. Even fewer express problems getting to the remaining nine destinations.

♣ Members with *poor* HDS are significantly more likely, however, to experience problems finding transportation to seven of these destinations.

Members were asked how satisfied they are with how they can get around their community when they want or need to go someplace. Most members indicate they are satisfied, with more than seven in ten members indicating they are extremely satisfied.

♣ Significantly more members with *excellent* HDS (83%) indicate they are very satisfied

Satisfaction with Transportation in Their Community (N=3,361)




with how they get around in their community when they want or need to get somewhere than those with *poor* HDS (50%). About one in ten (9%) of those with *poor* HDS report they are dissatisfied.


Would AARP members live in their community if they could no longer drive?

More than one in four drivers strongly agrees with the statement that it would be difficult to continue to live in their current community if they were no longer able to drive, and another one in five somewhat agree with it. About one in three report they disagree with the statement.

Evaluation of Neighborhood Livability If No Longer Able to Drive (n=2,954, respondents who drive)




If members were no longer able to drive, most members indicate they would likely ride share. Half or more also say they would use public transportation, walk, or use vans for seniors.



Alternative transportation options are more limited for those with *poor* HDS than those with *excellent* HDS. Those with *excellent* HDS say they would use public transportation (75%) or walk (78%). Those with *poor* HDS are more likely to say they would use disability transportation (42%). Approximately the same percentages say they would ride share (*excellent*, 93% vs. *poor*, 88%) and prefer a senior or community van (*excellent*, 53% vs. *poor*, 54%).

Nearly half of members say that having more driving alternatives, such as community vans, volunteer drivers, and carpooling would assist them if they could not get around as easily as they do now. The same percentage indicates that having more delivery services for groceries, prescription drugs, and other daily necessities would also help. Slightly more than two in five consider improved access to public transportation as a service that would help them remain in their current neighborhood.




♣ Members in Fort Collins (51%) and Grand Junction (48%) are more likely than those in Pueblo (39%) or Denver (28%) to indicate that improved access to public transportation would make it easier for them to remain in their current neighborhood.

Those members with *poor* HDS are more likely to mention having more delivery services (*poor*, 58% vs. *excellent*, 42%) while those with *excellent* HDS are more likely to mention improved access to public transportation (*excellent*, 46% vs. *poor*, 34%).


Two-thirds (67%) of members report if they could no longer live in their neighborhood they are at least somewhat likely to move to one with better public transportation. Three in ten indicate they are not likely to move.

Those members statewide (49%) and those who reside in Fort Collins (46%) are more likely to report they would move to a new neighborhood than those in Denver (38%).

In choosing a new neighborhood, buses and community vans for seniors or people with disabilities were the most preferred transit options.




♣ Members who reside in Fort Collins (45%) and Grand Junction (44%) are more likely than those who live in Denver (34%) to say they prefer buses. While Denver members are more likely to say they prefer commuter trains (Denver, 16%; Fort Collins, 4%; and Grand Junction, 2%).

Members with poor HDS prefer community vans for seniors or people with disabilities (poor, 54% vs. excellent, 27%). Those with excellent HDS are more likely to prefer buses (excellent, 46% vs. poor, 24%) and commuter trains (excellent, 12% vs. poor, 3%).


What is the health and disability status of AARP members?


Nearly three in ten members have an *excellent* HDS score, and another two in five have a *good* HDS score. One in five, however, have a *poor* HDS rating.



♣ The percentage of members who rate a *poor* HDS status climbs significantly with age (50-74, 13%; 75-79, 31%; 80-84, 38%; 85+, 50%).
